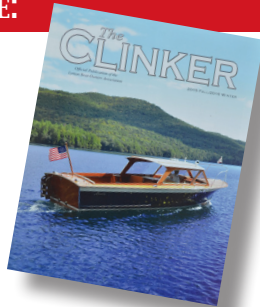

## LBOA HISTORY

The Lyman Boat Owner's Association started out in the mid 1970's as a small group of enthusiasts organized by Frederick C. Jackson of Syracuse New York. Originally known as the Lyman Owner's Group, the association quickly grew to almost 300 members.

After several years an occupational change did not allow Mr. Jackson to devote the time that had become necessary to continue running the organization. Not wanting to see the group decline, he handed over the management to the Thousand Islands Shipyard Museum which later became, The Antique Boat Museum in Clayton New York. Unfortunately without the guidance and enthusiasm of Mr. Jackson, the group membership declined and eventually went dormant.

In the early 1980's Dale Hooper of Elyria Ohio obtained the records from the Museum and revived the group as The Lyman Boat Owners Association. The organization quickly grew back to almost 300 members.



Today the LBOA boasts one of the largest memberships of any group dedicated to classic boats with over 700 enthusiasts from all across the country.

The association is dedicated to preserving Lyman boats and the history behind them. The LBOA publishes *The Clinker*, a quarterly magazine full of photos, historical information, and restoration advice. We also currently host numerous boating events around the country wherever Lyman's are cherished.
